Do Everything in Love

There is a Scripture that expresses the idea that the child of God should do everything in love (1 Corinthians 16:14). Now, first and second Corinthians are not books one would want to take a single scripture out to make a point, but this verse can stand by itself, because if one looks at the verses around 1 Corinthians 16:14, one will quickly discover that Paul meant what he was writing: 'do everything in love.' If one reads the entire chapter, one will soon understand that Paul reminds his audience (including contemporary believers) to always act in love.

Our human nature probably wants to look for the loophole: 'do everything in love except...' fill in the ellipse with what is most relevant to you and your current circumstance. Paul is not writing in a vacuum; Paul agrees with the entirety of Scripture in this one verse. I will explain more momentarily.

First, let us look at 1 Corinthians 16:14 word for word. In the King James, the verse reads: "Let all your things be done with charity" 1 Corinthians 16:14. If we examine the words in their original meaning, here is what we discover: The first word of the verse is 'Let.' The term 'let' is a prolongation and middle voice form of a primary verb. The Greek means: 'come to pass.' The next word, 'all' translates as 'everything.' The term 'your' means 'you.' Then the word 'things' means 'whatsoever.' Next comes the phrase, 'be done,' which is also a prolongation and middle voice form of a primary verb meaning 'come to pass.' We come to the word 'with' next. Looking to the original language, 'with' is a primary preposition denoting a fixed position in place, time, or state. The final word is 'charity,' and in the original Greek, the term 'agape' is used. We understand the word 'agape' refers to God's kind of love. So literally, we could interpret the words: 'let everything come to pass, that you do; and let it come to pass fixed in God's way of love.'

Looking at the original language helps me understand just how much emphasis is placed on the Christian's responsibility to love like God. So, how does God love? I'm glad you ask. Remember I wrote: 'Paul is not writing in a vacuum; Paul is agreeing with the entirety of Scripture?' Now I will explain as I address this query.

God loves us with a desire to make amends or reparations. The theological word that describes this

act is 'atone.' Thus, God loves us with an atoning love (John 3:16); this is a big deal because it is not God Who needs to ask forgiveness. We have wronged God, yet God has provided forgiveness through His dear Son's work at Calvary. So, to love like God—to do everything in love, in part, means I love and work to bring reparations even when I am not the one who has committed the wrong.

God's love is also restorative. The theological word to describe this is 'redeem.' God has made the believers' redemption possible (Romans 8:3-4; Galatians 3:13). Again, this is awesome because humanity chose to set itself away from God. God never moved away from humanity, yet God, moved by compassion, made the way of redemption possible for humanity through Christ Jesus. So, to love like God means I work to restore relationships that others have severed, and this does not come naturally to our human nature. Human nature says, 'They have cut ties with me, good, who needs them.' The Christians' new nature in Christ should attempt to restore our human relationships. Sure, some people will reject this expression of love, but your responsibility is not to make them accept your restoration; your obligation is to offer restoration. God provides restoration for everyone, but only some receive His expression of love (Matthew 7:14). Offer restoration to all; this is another way we do everything in love.

I could continue to describe attributes of God's agape love and how the Christian should mirror His agape love by 'doing all things in love.' Nevertheless, we have considered two of the most demanding aspects of 'doing everything in love.' My challenge to you (and me) is to try these two aspects. Attempt to do everything in God's agape love. It is not easy, nor does it come naturally to the flesh. By His Holy Spirit's indwelling presence, ask Him to help you do everything in agape love, and watch how His Spirit will help you love like He loves and execute all things in His agape love.





Crafting for Young Friends Valentine Keeper


You Will Need: Heart stickers and an empty cotton tips box.
