

Staircase to the Possible

You can do the impossible. Often impossibilities are placed along our path, not to be a hindrance but rather a staircase to the possible. You can do the impossible, but there is a condition that must first be met.

In the Gospel of John, Jesus says, anyone who believes in Me will do the same works I have done, and even greater works, because I am going to the Father. Ask anything in My Name, and I will do it so that the Son can bring glory to the Father. If you love me, obey my commandments. I will ask the Father, and He will give you another Advocate, Who will never leave you. He is the Holy Spirit, Who leads us into all truth. The world cannot receive Him because it isn't looking for Him and doesn't recognize Him, but you know Him. I will not abandon you as orphans. I will come to you (John 14:12-18).

Jesus said greater works you will do because He goes to the Father. Jesus said, ask anything in His Name, and He will do it for you because He goes to the Father. Sometimes the Spiritually immature will take these verses and make them about financial gain or material wealth, which is not what I am talking about; Jesus should be the only treasure we seek. The very condition that you can do the impossible hinges on your knowing Christ Jesus in the free pardon of sin.

In Philippians 4:13, the Scripture states that you can do all things through Christ, Who will strengthen you. If you do not know Christ Jesus, you can never adequately achieve the impossible. Sin says 'I can' apart from Christ. That sin is 'pride,' and pride is both a sin and a result of our sin nature. Proverbs 16:18 assures that pride goes before destruction.

A classic example of this kind of pride is the Tower of Babel (Genesis 11:1–9). The people said we will build a tower to God. In essence, they were saying, 'we are our own god; we do not need the One True God.' God confused their language, and their plans came to naught. Then God turns to an unassuming 75-year-old (Genesis 12:4) named Abram (Abraham) and makes a great nation of him. Abraham and Sarah have a great weakness; they are infertile and well advanced in years—their impossibility was getting ready to change when Abraham put his faith in God. While Abraham and Sarah did not trust God perfectly, Abraham did believe God. Romans 4:3 affirms that

Abraham believed God and God counted his belief as righteousness because of his faith. Abraham did the impossible, but do you see, it was God at work in his life—God used Abraham to achieve the impossible. God wants to use you too, and often impossibilities are placed along your path, not to be a hindrance but rather a staircase to the possible.

You can do the impossible when you first repent and ask Jesus into your life as Savior and Lord. Next, submit to His will, not your own. Finally, as Saint Augustine once said, "Pray as though everything depended on God. Work as though everything depended on you."

Paul asked God to remove his thorn in the flesh, and every time God would remind Paul that His grace was sufficient to meet all Paul's needs. Paul then went on to say that he now takes pleasure in his weaknesses, in insults, hardships, persecutions, and troubles. All that Paul suffered was what made Paul strong (2 Corinthians 12:8-10). Jesus working through Paul's adversity led Paul to do the impossible, and God working through Abraham and Sarah's inability was what led them to achieve the impossible.

Yes, you can do the impossible when Christ resides in you. Our hindrances and inabilities can become the instruments that allow us to do the impossible. When we do the impossible, that should bring glory to the Father. God will be glorified in the lives of all who are willing to allow Him to use their inabilities. Again, you must know Christ in the free pardon of sin. You must be willing to surrender your will to His will. You must be willing to both pray and work; you must allow God to have the glory because when you achieve the impossible, it is not you but Christ in you that has made the impossible possible.

The Impossible is Possible when Christ Resides in Me. If you know Christ in the free pardon of sin, and you are surrendered to His will for your life, do not get bogged down in your inability and weakness. Instead, give these feelings of inadequacy and shortcomings to God and watch God use them as the staircase which leads to the possible.

OUR LEGACY: a tribute to GEORGE FOX and WILLIAM EDMUNDSON

Recently we received correspondence from Ellen Johnson. While cleaning out her mother's attic, she came across a play written by her step-great grandmother, Josephine Rhodes Davis. The play was first performed in 1929 and commemorated the first recorded religious service in North Carolina.

As 2022 is the 350th anniversary of this significant occasion, Mrs. Johnson permitted us to reprint portions of the play in the Lamplighter over the coming months. We wanted everyone to have a chance to read the work of Josephine Rhodes Davis. This work reveals the early Quaker desire to bring Christianity to the Colonies. The original signed manuscript, donated by Mrs. Johnson, has been placed in the Up River library for preservation. Episode II

SECOND PART: THE FAITH OF THE CHRISTIAN

TIME: The morning following

PLACE: Whitehall, London

PERSONS: Oliver Cromwell, Lord Protector of England, Captain Drury, his life-guard George Fox, a prisoner

(Oliver Cromwell is seen seated. Enter Captain Drury. He salutes the Protector, handing him a rolled paper.)

CAPT. DRURY: My Lord Protector, the answer of George Fox, the Quaker. I have him in custody.

CROMWELL: (taking the paper, unrolls it and reads): "To the Protector by the name of Oliver Cromwell: Herein I declare in the presence of God that I am come into the covenant of peace which was before Page 7

strifes were: that I am sent to bring people from the causes of war and fighting—"

(Cromwell throws down the paper, saying to Captain Drury):

Bring him hither.

(Exit Captain Drury, to re-enter with George Fox carrying his Bible.)

GEORGE FOX: Peace be in this house!

CROMWELL: George Fox, I have heard much of you, and desired to see you long, and am glad you are here.

(Then reading from the paper.)

You say you are sent to bring people from the "causes of war and fighting." I am told you quarrel with my ministers.

GEORGE FOX: I am sent to bring them back to the simplicity and purity of the early Church; to bring them off from ceremonies and men's inventions. I preach "God is love," "Love one another."

CROMWELL: That is very good.

GEORGE FOX: I preach the "Kingdom of Heaven is within" them. I bid them be what they believe and assert themselves. That is what Christ did: assert Himself and suffer.

CROMWELL: It is the truth.

GORGE FOX: It is the truth, and to discover a truth involves the task of going out and doing it. Therefore, I contend with thy ministers.

CROMWELL: George Fox, you are at liberty. Come again to my house, for if you and I were but an hour of a day together, we should be nearer one to another.

GEORGE FOX: The Lord of heaven and earth bless thee.

It's a place our family spends a significant amount of time: Sunday's, 3 preschool days a week, and, with it being a mile from our house, MANY sunny afternoons.


Crafting for Young Friends Cupcake Paper Flower

You Will Need: Cupcake paper cups, pipe cleaner, drinking straw, and scissors.

1) Start by cutting, with scissors, the cupcake paper cups (fringe the edges). **REMEMBER!** Any time a child uses scissors, there must be an adult present. Then, put all the fringed cupcake paper cups together and make a hole through the middle of each paper.



2) Next, thread the pipe cleaner through the papers and crunch one end so the papers do not fall off the pipe cleaner. Take the opposite end of the pipe cleaner and thread it through the drinking straw. Once it is threaded through, clamp off that opposite end.



3) Finally, enjoy the paper flower, or repeat the process to make a bouquet.
