American Kickapoo, Albemarle Food Bank, and the Homeless Feed. Our total giving to these projects for 2021 was \$3,207.82.



My Vision Statment

Sunday School: (Children, Youth, and Adult) Up River's vision for Sunday school is to build biblical literacy. Biblical literacy is the ability to rightly read and understand the Bible, using the proper tools of study, thereby becoming well acquainted with the Bible's character (innate qualities) and content. We want our children, youth, and adults to know the grand narrative of scripture from an exegetical and literal study of the canonized Books of the Bible.

Youth group: Up River's vision for our youth group is to foster an environment where the youth can build deep and strong roots in their relationship with God. We want our youth to be equipped with the right tools and knowledge to stand firm in their faith at school, in difficult situations they face, and once they have graduated.

Preschool: Up River's vision for our preschool is to teach children at an age appropriate level in order to prepare them to enter Kindergarten and to develop appropriate social and emotional skills. We want to pour into them the love of Christ through bible stories and through building strong stable relationships with their peers and teachers.

VBS: Up River's vision for VBS is to offer a fun and inviting atmosphere to teach the Gospel to children in our church but

also as our biggest outreach event for our community. The primary message is always the Gospel and salvation.

Camp: Youth-MFuge: Every moment spent at FUGE is intentional. Camp programming is designed to take students out of their normal routine and place them into an environment that is focused on life-change through relationship with Christ. During the day our students will be challenged and stretched as individuals; in the evenings, we have an opportunity to build group unity over dinner, worship, fellowship and church group devotions. MFuge is designed to give students a mission experience that opens their eyes to similar opportunities they may have to serve in their own communities, learning to live life each day on mission!

Kids-CentriKid: Centrikid is an overnight camp for 2nd-6th graders to experience the time of their lives and learn more about the message of Jesus Christ! Camps are staffed by college and seminary students who can't wait to hang out with our kids and love to share Christ through every aspect of camp. A child's spiritual life can be greatly impacted by their home environment, church involvement, and unique experiences like camp. CentriKid is committed to providing a place for kids to get away to hear loud and clear that God loves them and has a plan for their lives. Safety in programming, within relationships, and on campus are top priorities. We believe powerful things can happen when kids feel safe to be a kid!





Crafting for Young Friends Paper Snowflake

You Will Need: 8.5x11 piece of paper and scissors.

1) Scissors are optional. You can tear the snowflake if you wish, or you might find it easier to use scissors. REMEMBER! Any time a child uses scissors, there must be an adult present.

2) Start by folding the 8.5x11 paper into a triangle. Cut or tear the remaining rectangle part away. You can save that piece for another craft project.



4) Open the triangle once and fold one side in and the other side over. It should look like a rocket ship.



5) Finally, cut or tear the outside areas of the 'rocket ship' shape. Be careful not to cut or tear every folded area; otherwise, your snowflake will fall apart, and you will have to begin again. Once you have the shapes cut, unfold the paper to reveal the snowflake.




