A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR:

DEAR FRIENDS:

FEED THE HUNGRY!

Isaiah 58:10 instructs us to, "Feed the hungry, and help those in trouble. Then your light will shine out from the darkness, and the darkness around you will be as bright as noon." Isaiah 58:10 (NLT)

When I think about this verse I think about the good feeling one feels when they help someone in need. We are told in Isaiah, "Feed the hungry, and help those in trouble." You know, there are all kinds of trouble and all kinds of hunger in this world. There are people who are physically hungry. Our meeting participates in several feeding ministries. One where we feed the homeless, one where we provide nourishment at a soup kitchen, and one where we hand out groceries in the community. In addition, around Thanksgiving, we select six or seven families in our community and supply them with Thanksgiving dinner.

There are people who hunger for God's Word. They long for community with other believers to talk about the importance of Scripture and its life-giving application. There may be others who do not know that it is God's Word for which they hunger, and until someone brings the Word to them, they will not know it is His Word which will satisfy their hunger. Psalm 34:8a reminds, "Taste and see that the LORD is good." (NLT).

One can help meet the need of hunger through volunteering at a school, meeting the needs of children who *hunger *for love and attention. One can help meet the need of hunger through visiting at a nursing home, turning loneliness into happiness.

Regardless of how one meets a hunger need, it feels good to meet someone's need. In a way, God works through our hands when we help others. If we keep our hands, hearts, and lives closed to others then God isn't able to work through us. Maybe the people who complain that they never witness God work in our world, do so because we are falling short of meeting hunger needs in this world. What if we stand before God one day and He says, * why did you not show Me through the life I gave you*? When we open our hands, hearts, and lives and work with others and extend opportunities then something beautiful happens you reflect the light of Christ in this dark world. Isaiah reminds, "Feed the hungry, and help those in trouble. Then your light will Isaiah continues, "and the darkness around you will be as bright as shine out from the darkness..." noon." There is no arguing that the sun seems to be its brightest at noon—because it is during the noon hours that the sun appears to be at the highest place in our sky. What else does the sun do? It reflects light off of the moon, planets, asteroids, natural satellites, and comets-making them appear to be as bright as the stars. When, we meet the needs of others, not only are we bringing the light of hope to the darkness, we are reflecting the light of Christ in the darkness. "We now have this light shining in our hearts, but we ourselves are like fragile clay jars containing this great treasure. This makes it clear that our great power is from God, not from ourselves." 2 Corinthians 4:7 (NLT)

Is there someone in your life that you can lend a listening ear or a helping hand? Your light will be pleasing to God as it glorifies Him, and you might be helping meet someone's hunger need. I challenge you, go feed the hungry.

HOMELESS FEEDING IN ELIZABETH CITY:

The following article is about the feeding on July 29th and is being shared by Robin Winslow. Thank you so very much for sharing Robin - we greatly appreciate your contribution.

Our Meeting participates in feeding the homeless. I have been hesitant to volunteer because I was so worried that I would mess up somehow. Robert signed himself and Hannah up for this past one (last night.) He asked me to pick up the beverages for it and said that I was welcome to come help. Even though I was still nervous, and truly I was concerned about silly things, I found that a willing heart and willing hands is really all that is required. I was nervous, yes, but ...once these beautiful individuals began to line up to be served that nervousness disappeared. My emotions ran the gamut and at times it was difficult not to cry. I had asked God to help me by filling my heart with compassion and love. That was definitely answered! The dignity displayed by each individual, the smiles, the gratitude, etc., was an eye-opening experience for me. Several individuals asked if they could take a to-go plate to a family member who was unable to get to the venue for one reason or another. Of course we met those requests. This is a fairly small area so I was saddened to see so many people in need. I was so happy to see them be able to eat their fill. Many coming through the line were cheerful, asking us how we were doing and if it was hot enough for us. (I was beyond perspiring as a true Southern lady should.) With the Lord's help I maintained a smile throughout each encounter. I would not have done anything to hurt or offend any of these beautiful souls. I left feeling blessed, yes, but my heart was still asking what more could I do. As we were leaving, two of the youngest diners shared their stories. The young man speaking with us said once he was employed he wanted to know how he could donate to the ministry because he appreciated the meal and wanted to give back. I am so glad I overcame my fear so that I could participate. I am humbled by what God has shown me. Perhaps this experience has opened my heart to what God is calling me to do. God's grace is sufficient, I wish it hadn't taken me so long to learn this. God can, and will, use even those of us who still need a lot of work. For me, that is truly humbling. I pray that he continues to give me eyes that see and a heart filled with compassion and love.

"He leads me beside still waters ... " Although we often prefer noisy distractions, God knows we need quiet to hear him and have our souls restored.

"You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies." Rather than a boast ("Ha! See how God spreads a banquet in my honor while others look on!"), this is a reminder that God wants us to dine with our enemies. We might not be able to stand those people, but God pursues reconciliation.

In the process, "goodness and mercy ... follow me all ... my life." That's what we need the most.




