

OUR LEGACY: a tribute to GEORGE FOX and WILLIAM EDMUNDSON

Recently we received correspondence from Ellen Johnson. While cleaning out her mother's attic, she came across a play written by her step-great grandmother, Josephine Rhodes Davis. The play was first performed in 1929 and commemorated the first recorded religious service in North Carolina.

As 2022 is the 350th anniversary of this significant occasion, Mrs. Johnson permitted us to reprint portions of the play in the Lamplighter over the coming months. We wanted everyone to have a chance to read the work of Josephine Rhodes Davis. This work reveals the early Quaker desire to bring Christianity to the Colonies. The original signed manuscript, donated by Mrs. Johnson, has been placed in the Up River library for preservation. Now we hope you will enjoy the fifth and final installment of *OUR LEGACY: a tribute to GEORGE FOX and WILLIAM EDMUNDSON.*

Episode III

Carrying the Religion of Christ into Carolina

THIRD PART: "THE RIGHTEOUS SHALL LIVE BY HIS FAITH"

TIME: November, 1672
PLACE: Edenton, North Carolina
PERSONS: Governor of North Carolina (believed to be Peter Carteret) and his wife
George Fox, founder of Society of Friends
Indian Chief (believed to be Kilcokonen, of the Yeopim Tribe) Interpreter to Indian Chief
Spirit of Prophecy

(George Fox is found stranded near Edenton; the governor goes to his aid; they return to the governor's house.)

WIFE OF THE GOVERNOR: For what reason have you tarried so long?

GOVERNOR: The water was so shallow the boat would not swim. We were fain to put off our shoes and stockings and wade through the water some distance.

GEORGE FOX: Are you free to receive me?

WIFE: You are very welcome.

GOVERNOR: My heart and house are open to receive you.

GEORGE FOX: On my way here I espied several wigwams of the Indians and drew near them but could not converse with them. I desire to signify something to the Indian Chief for his people, but where shall the meeting be?

WIFE (*pausing*) : I think at this house.

GOVERNOR: The Indian Chief is a kindly spirited man, and may come. I will send for him and an interpreter.

(Exit the Governor.)

GEORGE FOX: I have had many precious meetings along the Albemarle.

WIFE: I want to hear you preach, George Fox, but I want most to hear some mechanics preach, shoemakers, and such rustics.

GORGE FOX: Some of them are rather the best preachers we have amongst us. (Then, thinking of his own early days.) They are over it all: they preach experimentally.

WIFE: Many of your people appear to have been made over again.

GEORGE FOX: To live in Christ is not to be done unperceivably.

(Enter the Governor, Indian Chief, and Interpreter.)

GOVERNOR (*in the manner of an introduction*): Kilcokonen, my friends, Chief of the Yeopim Tribe.

GEORGE FOX: We are glad you are come. (The Interpreter makes signs upon his hand indicating what has been said.)

Signify that I have come from a far country with a message from the Great Man above. Tell him that my message is to persuade his people not to be drunkards, nor steal, nor kill one another.

(The Interpreter translates this.)

Ask him whether or no, when he does lie or do wrong to any one, there is not something in him that does reprove him for it?

(The Interpreter translates this.)

INTERPRETER: He says there is such a thing in him that does so reprove; and he is ashamed when he does wrong.

GEORGE FOX: Aye, the Light that lighteth every one that cometh into the world!

GOVERNOR: George Fox, you are very weary. If you will rest now, then stay with us tonight, you will be as welcome as our own children.

GEORGE FOX: I am very weary and will rest. Tomorrow I must go by Sound about thirty miles, to the home of Joseph Scott.

(George Fox goes to the Indian Chief, and placing his hand in his, lifts both to his own heart.)

My love, Kilcokonen: we are brothers.

INTERPRETER: We are glad we have come.

(Exit the Governor, Indian Chief, and Interpreter. There is silence as George Fox turns and opens his belongings. The Governor's wife exits, then re-enters with water to drink; she finds George Fox has taken a seat and fallen asleep; she quietly arranges some comforts for him, then leaves the room. The Spirit of Prophecy enters.)

S. OF P.: Neither wintry sleet nor the burning sun has detained thee. Cease now, cease from thy dangers and thy undertakings: thy rewards are won! Across the centuries I perceive this very people, grown strong in faith and hope and love.

I see them all a-gathered
With a love-light in their eyes;
I hear them pledge together
Softly, something in this wise:
We will keep the faith our fathers kept:
The faith and love of two
Who crossed the seas for our dear sakes—
Lord, help us so to do!

Follow Me: Covered with the Dust of The Rabbi

Some Biblical scholars believe that in the first century, it was deemed the highest of honor for a young man to be chosen by a rabbi. If the rabbi thought you were bright enough to follow his lead and do precisely as he did, he would say, "Follow me." Parents were pleased

to know their offspring was chosen for this high honor, and they would say, "May you be covered with the dust of your rabbi." In other words, may you walk so closely to your rabbi that you both factually and figuratively be covered in his dust. A chosen follower was expected to take on the mannerisms of the rabbi so that one day the rabbi's ideas would be perpetuated to future generations right down to the slightest nuance. The rabbi's walk, gestures, dress, facial expressions, and especially his teachings were to be replicated by his chosen follower.

When the rabbi rejected a young man, the rabbi would say, "Go home, and pray that your offspring may become a Rabbi. Go home and learn the family business." I wonder if this might have happened to young Levi? Mark recalls that Levi was the son of Alphaeus (Mark 2:14). I wonder if a rabbi had rejected Levi? Levi was a tax collector. No one liked tax collectors because they would

add value for themselves to survive. Unfortunately, some tax collectors would add too much value and fleece the people. I could imagine Levi wanting to be done with such a questionable occupation. In that day, your choice was to do what your father did. Perhaps tax collecting had been handed from father to son for generations? Scripture does not tell us; all Scripture says is Levi was the son of Alphaeus. Scripture does not tell us that a rabbi had ever rejected Levi; I merely wonder.

Scripture does tell us that The Rabbi, Jesus, said to Levi, "Follow Me." Immediately, Levi left his work

as a tax collector and followed Jesus. I wonder how thrilled Levi was to hear Jesus' words? Levi could leave his old life behind and start afresh. Levi had been chosen as a bright young man to follow and replicate The Rabbi Jesus in every way—leaving the

old and embracing the new.

We often lose the understanding of just how lifechanging the call of a rabbi was in the first century—a life-altering high calling. The fact is, this high calling is still offered today. Today, it is offered to more than just young men. The Rabbi, Jesus, asks children, the elderly, women, men, and people from all walks of life to follow Him. We accept this high calling by placing our belief in His atoning work for our lives (Romans 10:9). 1 John 1:9 assures us that He will forgive us if we confess our sins. Jesus has made the way for us to follow Him. We start this journey of following Him by putting our belief in His atoning work. We trust that He has forgiven all our sin debt and that His righteousness now covers us. Then, we learn the ways of our Rabbi and share His teachings with others.






Crafting for Young Friends Seashell Fish

You Will Need: School glue, paint & paintbrush, googly eye, one large Scallop shell, and two small Common Atlantic Abra shells.

1) Start with a nice-sized Scallop Shell for the body of your fish. Select the color or colors of paint that you wish to paint your fish. For best results, paint your fish body and fins separately. Common Atlantic Abra Shells make excellent fins for your fish. Patiently wait for the paint to dry.









2) Then, decide how you want to put your fish together. Once you have it the way you want it, glue the shells together. You can also glue the googly eye on your fish. Next, wait for the glue to dry. It could take a good deal of time, so you might want to move to another project and come back to your fish at a later date.

3) The final step is to decide if you want to make your fish into a refrigerator magnet, wall art, a puppet, or just a conversation piece. If you choose a refrigerator magnet, merely glue a magnet to the back of your fish. If you choose wall art, mount your fish in a shadow box for display. If you decide to make a puppet, attach your fish to a stick. Finally, if you want your fish to be a conversation piece, just leave the fish as is and show it to your friends.
