A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR:

DEAR FRIENDS:

THANKSGIVING TRIALS and PROBLEMS?

Can you believe it's November? We are entering the season where we take time to remember and reflect on all the many things we have to be thankful for. I truly think this is a good practice. We live in a world that appears to be concerned with getting more and more, it is good to step back and reflect on the many things that God has given to us already, the many things for which we should be thankful.

When we make our list of things for which we are thankful, we might not include problems and trials, but how many times have problems and trials led us to a place of greater confidence and strength? Thus, maybe our list of things for which we are thankful should also include the *not so pleasant times that have brought us our present victories*.

Paul had this thought in mind when he wrote, "We can rejoice, too, when we run into problems and trials, for we know that they help us develop endurance. And endurance develops strength of character, and character strengthens our confident hope of salvation" (Romans 5:3, NLT).

We tend to become sad or frustrated when we face trials and problems. Paul says we can rejoice because we know that they help us develop endurance. I am reminded of the words I once heard a young person share. He said, "In this life God places us in His oven. In here it is hot and it hurts. No one likes being in the oven but when life is over, and the bell dings, God takes us out of the oven and says, "Well done good and faithful servant." Even though trials and problems seldom feel good, the endurance they help us build should lead us to a place of thankfulness. Always remember God wants us to appreciate life even when we're going through tough times.

Paul doesn't stop there. He says, "endurance develops strength of character" There is an old poem that reads, "I asked God for strength, that I might achieve, I was made weak, that I might learn humbly to obey...I asked for health, that I might do greater things, I was given infirmity that I might do better things...I asked for riches, that I might be happy, I was given poverty that I might be wise...I asked for power, that I might have the praise of men, I was given weakness, that I might feel the need of God...I asked for all things, that I might enjoy life, I was given life, that I might enjoy all things...I got nothing that I asked for—but everything I hoped for, Almost despite myself, my unspoken prayers were answered. I am among all people, most richly blessed" (Unknown).

Paul concludes, "character strengthens our confident hope of salvation." During the Great Depression, there was a year when crops weren't good, and a family was running desperately short on potatoes. They had to decide if they were going to eat the potatoes or plant them for a new crop come spring—short-term satisfaction or long-term benefits. The family determined that they could eat the potatoes, but peel them with very thick peelings, and plant the thick peelings in spring. As it turns out, they had the best crop of potatoes ever.

What an important lesson we can learn from this family regarding Paul's words, "character strengthens our confident hope of salvation." Rather than just focusing on the current desire, the family was willing to

skimp and put off what they wanted now in order to reap a greater reward later. Are you thankful even in the lean times? Are you thankful when you reap the greater reward? Are you thankful when problems and trials lead to greater joy?
