# **OUR LEGACY:** a tribute to GEORGE FOX and WILLIAM EDMUNDSON

Recently we received correspondence from Ellen Johnson who came across a play written by her step-great grandmother, Josephine Rhodes Davis. The play was first performed in 1929 and commemorated the first recorded religious service in North Carolina.

As 2022 is the 350th anniversary of this significant occasion, Mrs. Johnson permitted us to reprint portions of the play in the Lamplighter over the coming months. Now we hope you will enjoy the second installment of *OUR LEGACY: a tribute to GEORGE FOX and WILLIAM EDMUNDSON.* 

### Episode II

FIRST PART: THE COURAGE OF THE CHRISTIAN

TIME: 1654

PLACE: A wayside, near London

PERSONS: George Fox, an itinerant preacher Captain Drury, a life-guard to Oliver Cromwell

(Enter George For, dressed in a leathern suit, carrying a staff, a Bible, and a small package.)

GEORGE FOX: There they are again, the crowd! There they are again! Crying "Leathern Breeches is coming! Leather Breeches is coming!" Aye, how much is the world in love with folly than with wisdom. They think me a wild, mad, scurrilous fellow in a leathern suit, going about making disturbances in the steeple-houses, and abusing ministers. I have visited in almost every hamlet and town from Falmouth up to Aberdeen, wherever they would allow me to have meetings amongst them. It is work, work, work in obedience to the Light within. My only rest is a sojourn in prison: but nothing makes a man stronger than locking him up for a little while with Christ. Today I have tried first at the inn, then at two private houses to get a little meat and drink and lodging for my money, but they denied me; so I will sir here until

break of day. (While George For is putting down his staff, Bible and package, Captain Drury appears.)

**CAPT. DRURY**: George Fox? George Fox, the Quaker?

**GEORGE FOX**: I am called so in scorn.

**CAPT. DRURY**: I am come in the name of our Lord Protector to make charges against you.

GEORGE FOX: Say on. What have I done?

**CAPT. DRURY**: It is charged that your religious gatherings have a political meaning: look to answer for yourself, for if you do not, our Lord Protector will conclude that what is exhibited against you is true.

**GEORGE FOX**: I am an innocent man, free from plots, and deny all such works.

**CAPT. DRURY**: You are asked to go home, and keep at home, and not go to meetings in the future.

**GEORGE FOX**: If I promise so, it will imply that I am guilty of something: and if I go to meetings it will be said I have broken thine order. I must have my liberty to serve God and go to meetings. I cannot submit to thy requirings. . . We are a peaceable people.

**CAPT. DRURY**: Well then, you must go before the Protector. (*George Fox turns to pick up his Bible, staff and package. Captain Drury takes the package from him.*) What here? Political papers? Open.

(George Fox opens the small package.)

Clean and delicate linen! Such does not belong to a vagrant. Come, let us be on our way.




# Crafting for Young Friends Caterpillar Puppet

You Will Need: Egg carton, google eyes, pipe cleaner, straws, marker, tape, scissors, school glue.

1) Start by cutting, with scissors, the top off the egg carton. Then, cut the bottom of the egg carton into two parts. **REMEMBER!** Any time a child uses scissors, there must be an adult present.




2) Next, take one part of the egg carton bottom and attach the google eyes to the end with glue. With a marker, draw a smile under the google eyes. Carefully make two holes to bring the pipe cleaner antenna through the head of the caterpillar puppet.



3) Finally, attach two straws, with tape, to the underside of the caterpillar puppet (what would be the inside of the egg carton). Now, enjoy playing with your caterpillar puppet.
